There are many areas that indicate that you are appreciative of what happens in school such as, My child enjoys coming to school – 97%; My child is well taught – 97%; My child is safe – 99%; however, there are areas that indicate we need to perhaps review some of our systems such as our ability to *listen to concerns and seek your views* which had only 81% positive response overall. So now we are seeking your views on how you think we can improve this – ALL suggestions seriously considered.
