#### Reports and Targets for Children

#### Timetable at home..ideas for structure/routine to consider

**After lunch:**  $1.00 - 3.00/4.00 \sim$  **topic work** and/or **practical activities** (as set/suggested by teacher or your own ideas – there are many ideas on the internet in response to the Covid-19 lockdown); **reading** (a daily 'must' please); **physical activities** (please note the Joe Wicks daily exercise on You Tube). Thank you to all who are responding – it is vital the children keep a pattern of learning and 'doing' – it will allow for an easier transition back to school routine.
