### Faith WEEK: A week to focus on other faiths and cultures

Last week, a selection of our classes visited places of worship important to the faiths in our local community: children from our school visited St Chad's cathedral for a deeper understanding of the history of our own faith, as well as St Peter's Church in Harborne, the Central Birmingham Mosque, a Buddhist Pagoda and Singers Hill Hebrew Congregation Synagogue.

This was to address the findings of our recent Section 48 inspection report, which was to begin to "develop pupils' skills, knowledge and understanding of other faiths and cultures appropriate to their age and stage of development". Further to this though, it was to explore the local community and to deepen the children's understanding of who they are being called to be. We are in the process of overhauling our curriculum and this understanding – who God is calling the children to be and how they can be the leaders of tomorrow – is central to this.

#### November - Holy Souls - Liturgical focus

As you are already aware, November is the month when the Catholic Church remembers the dead. The month is dedicated to the Holy Souls. It is the month when both All Saints Day and All Souls Day is celebrated. Our celebration is of the life that was lived and acknowledges those who have 'gone before us' – especially our parents – live in us still.



1.In school, our class prayer tables will be decorated for this month with flowers, icons and photographs of our loved ones. We invite families to send in their pictures for our 'amor eterno' prayer focus.





2. Additionally, via the class teacher, please send in names of people in your family that you wish to be remembered in a special way. These names will be placed in our school prayer book and celebrated during this month.

3. Finally, as a way of launching our topic and giving the children a reference point, we will begin our celebration this week by watching the Disney Pixar film 'Coco'. This film is a PG but has been suitably vetted. If, for whatever reason, you do not wish your child to see this film, please make an appointment to come into school to discuss this.

This is extremely dangerous parking and has no concern for the children and parents who have to walk across the roads and for cars who have to manoeuvre around them. PLEASE have more consideration for the safety of the whole community.
