In their Science topic, the children are investigating the properties of materials.


















Year 3 news: As part of our Feast day

Year 6 have been working extremely hard in their 'Exciting Writing' lessons recounting Theseus' battle with the Minotaur.





Celebrating our beautiful world art work



Jewellery

To ensure the safety of all children, we will only allow children to wear small stud earrings (not dangly earrings) and a watch, on the days that they are not doing PE.

Start and End of day routines

"Drop and go'

Thank you for being patient with us this week as we all become accustomed to the beginning and end of day routines. They seem to be working really well and we will continue to review this in line with COVID guidance as the academic year progresses.

End of day

Please take note of the new end of day timings... following a review of end of day routines: -

At 3:10pm, Reception parents (once children are in full time) are to walk down the drive on the left hand side (as shown by the green arrows). Your child will be released to you, and you will leave by walking up the middle of the drive way.


At 3:15pm, Year 1 and Year 2 parents are to walk down the drive on the right hand side (as shown by the red arrows) Your child will be released to you, and you will leave by walking up the middle of the drive way.

At 3:20pm, siblings will be released to parents, who will walk down on the right hand side (as shown by the blue arrows). Your children will be released to you, and you will leave by walking up the middle of the drive way.

At 3:30pm, Year 3 and Year 4 parents are to walk down the drive on the left hand side (as shown by the green arrows). Your child will be released to you, and you will leave by walking up the middle of the drive way.

At 3:30pm, Year 5 and Year 6 parents are to walk down the drive on the right hand side (as shown by the red arrows) Your child will be released to you, and you will leave by walking up the middle of the drive way.

END OF DAY COLLECTION POINTS AND TIMES -



Please note: -

The school has a walking home policy that states that children should be picked up by the parents.

We encourage children to only walk home by themselves in the Summer term of Year 6.

Please remember if you, your child or any member of your household has <u>any symptoms</u> of COVID-19, do not send your children into school until they have had a PCR test. If the result comes back negative, then children can return to school if well enough, if the results come back positive, your child will need to isolate for 10 days after symptoms start and household members should take a PCR test.
