Sickness in school:

If your child is vomiting or has diarrhoea please <u>do NOT send them into school</u>. They must not return until they have experienced a clear 48 hours since their last bout of the symptoms. It really is terribly irresponsible to send children to school who are experiencing these symptoms. Last week we had a couple of children who had to go home as soon as they arrived. Inevitably this becomes a community problem with other children and staff picking up the sickness bug – and the cycle goes on. Please be considerate to the needs of your child and of our school. Thank you for your support.

Parking problems:

If you witness a parent parking illegally on Vivian Road (or the private roads that adjoin Vivian Road), please DO NOT confront them. We have had two recent incidents of a parent being challenged too forcibly - this creates upset and friction in the community. We recommend that you bring this issue straight into school. A member of the Senior Management Team will do their best to speak to the persons involved to resolve the matter without the upset that can so quickly arise otherwise.
