School Opening / Information:

We welcomed some of our Reception children this week – to a very different school experience from the one they left. The children have been a little subdued but are all aware of the regulations, which is wonderful. Thank you.

Next week a few more children will be starting. As we have stated, if we go over 30 children from Reception, we will need to re-organise the way we open as we simply do not have sufficient rooms to allow other children to return the following week.

Our plan, like a number of other schools, is to open Monday/Tuesday (1st group) – close on Wednesday to deep clean and then open Thursday/Friday for the second group of children from Reception/Y1 and eventually Y6. **Should we need to do this, we will inform you in good time.**

We have compiled a set of 'FAQs' –on website – <u>for all parents to read</u>. Please note this is updated regularly in accordance with new government information.

Home Learning

This will continue with the same vigour as before and we want to dedicate to this important service as it impacts the majority of our children and therefore remains one of our key priorities. Due to needing more staff in school, it may be that only one teacher will be overseeing all of the home learning in any given week for each year band. This will not affect the activities or the communication offered via the platform.



<u>Washing Hands!</u> It is crucial that, as we prepare to return to school in some form, that the children are really well trained in hand washing – 20 seconds with soap, in between fingers etc. If it is the single most important thing to do to protect ourselves (as we have been told), then it is the single most important preparation/training **you can provide** to your child in order to help us all stay safe when we return. PLEASE ensure they know that they ONLY need to press the soap pump ONCE!

The English Youth Online Chess Championship was held for the first time last week, which had a large number of England's strongest junior chess players taking part. In the Under 12 tournament, Tom finished on 6½ points from his 9 games, which was good enough to finish in 14th place out of 141 players, despite being an Under 9.
