






Year 5 Mass in Church - 22,9,21 at 9:15am



Monday was 'Roald Dahl story


Monday was 'Roald Dahl story

Can you do a **poster**, **picture**, **story board or model to show what we can do to make a difference?**These will be displayed in the porch and the church to give us all ideas of what to do.


Please put your entry in the <u>box on the piety stall before October 19th.</u>

Reminders







Please use book bags rather than rucksacks

Please can children attend school with their book bag and draw string PE bag.

The book bag has sufficient space for reading books and homework and the PE bag should contain pumps for indoor PE, that can be kept in school for the half term.

We are asking for this rather than the rucksacks as the rucksacks are too bulky and there is not enough space on the children's pegs for them all.

We will 'phase out' ruck sacks over the next few weeks and after half-term break it will be book bags only please.

Logo prints provide a service where book bags can be personalised if you wish for your child to have a bag that feels unique and special to them.



















Jewellery



To ensure the safety of all children, we will only allow children to wear small stud earrings (not dangly earrings) and a watch, on the days that they are not doing PE.

On PE days we are asking that children do not wear any jewellery, so that it is not lost if they are asked to remove it for physical lessons. Thank you for supporting us with this, your child's safety is at the forefront of our uniform decisions.

Y6 applications for Secondary Schools - apply before 31.10.2022

If you have a child currently in Year 6, please make sure that you have applied for their Secondary School.

If you live in Birmingham you should apply for your child's secondary school place online at

www.birmingham.gov.uk/schooladmissions between 1 September and 31 October 2021.

t is important that you submit your application by 31 October 2021. Applications received after the national closing date of 31 October 2021 will be treated as late applications. Late applicants are less likely to be offered a place at one of their preferred schools, and these applications will be processed after 1 March 2022, in accordance with Birmingham's coordinated admissions scheme.

Eschools

Eschools is a platform that teachers use to communicate with parents and set homework. This is checked regularly by teachers but not necessarily daily. Eschools is not the most efficient way to communicate with the Leadership team – please contact enquiry email or phone school for more urgent matters.

If your child needs a new password for Eschools, please contact the class teacher. If a parent needs a new password, please email school on forgottenpassword@stmaryrc.bham.sch.uk

Again, this may take a few days to reset.

We encourage parents to keep their passwords safe so that they do not miss any key information.



Start and End of day routines

Start of the day - 'Drop and go'

The gates will open at 8:30am. Miss. Price and/or Mrs. Davis will be at the yellow barrier.

End of the day - 'Pick up and go'

Please continue to be on time for pick up so that all classes are dismissed swiftly and safely.

3:10pm - Reception parents - walk down the drive on the left hand side.

Your child will be released to you, and you will leave by walking up the middle of the drive way.

3:15pm - Year 1 and Year 2 parents - walk down the drive on the right hand side.

Your child will be released to you, and you will leave by walking up the middle of the drive way.

If you are collecting children in the KS2 classes or the sibling group – please do not arrive until 3:20 to allow time for younger children to be dismissed first.

3:20pm - Sibling group - walk down the drive on the right hand side.

Your children will be released to you, and you will leave by walking up the middle of the drive way.

3:30pm - Year 3 and Year 4 parents - walk down the drive on the left hand side.

Your child will be released to you, and you will leave by walking up the middle of the drive way.

3:30pm - Year 5 and Year 6 parents - walk down the drive on the right hand side.

Your child will be released to you, and you will leave by walking up the middle of the drive way.

Please note: -

The school has a walking home policy that states that children should be picked up by the parents.

We encourage children to only walk home by themselves in the Summer term of Year 6.
