#### Large school bags?

We have <u>very limited space</u> in our infant cloakrooms (Y1, Y2) for the very large bags that the children are bringing into school. Due to the lack of space, bags and coats often end up on the floor as the large bags compete for the narrow space available for each child.

May we ask that these large bags be left at home and the children's book bags be used for books and the pieces of paper they are given? The children can carry in their water bottle (please label) and bring this into the classroom with them. Thank you for your cooperation in this.



#### Internet Safety Day – today 5th February

Mr Clinton has led year group assemblies on e-safety and focussed on the children's online behaviours to be safe; finding that many of the children are accessing games with age restrictions beyond their years – and some joining with internet friends to do so.

He also met today with a small number of parents who were interested to hear of the School's advice on internet safety.

What is clear is that the internet activity of your children needs to be very closely monitored and controlled. The children are learning today how to access unregulated material, often through curiosity and sometimes because of peer pressure from those they know and those they do not know in the real world. Such unmonitored/ unsupervised access can lead to the tragic circumstances that were highlighted in the press recently. The Health Secretary, Matt Hancock, spoke about the banning of phones in secondary schools because of the inherent dangers.

We need to be mindful that the good/bad habits the children develop in primary school will grow into the internet behaviours of Year 7 and upwards. Please help your child to establish good habits with very clear boundaries now.
