

Parents' Evening Feedback – October 2021



Dear parents/carers,

Thank you for attending our recent parents' evening. It was wonderful to have you all back in the school building; having the opportunity to talk to staff and view your children's work. **95%** of parents came to parents' evening and we are grateful for the support you show for your children and the staff at St Mary's.

While in the school building, we asked you to complete the following questionnaire. Thank you for your time to complete this. We had **130** responses and the results are summarised below:

#### Next steps:

We are pleased that the majority of our pupils have not experienced any bullying and that most parents feel that we deal with bullying promptly and effectively. At St Mary's, we ensure all pupils know they have someone in school who they can go to if they have a problem. #### Next steps:

We know how important parents are as partners in their children's education so we believe it is important that you feel well informed and involved in your child's education. To this end, we report progress to parents each term. This takes the form of two parents' evenings and one written report. Parents are encouraged to get in touch with staff should they have concerns about their child's progress and the class teacher will do the same.

During the rest of this academic year, there will be opportunities for parents to come in to school and work alongside their children in order to see how their child is doing in class. Please look out for information about this in the school newsletter and under the 'news' tab on our website.

#### Next steps:

We are blessed that so many of our teachers are prepared to give up their own time to enable your children to have rich opportunities before/after school. As we are returning to a more normal routine following the impact of Covid, we are endeavouring to increase our provision of before/after school clubs to ensure opportunities for children of all age groups. Please look out for information about new clubs in the school newsletter or via letters in book bags. We look forward to welcoming you as new clubs are offered.

The school makes me aware of what my child will learn during the year.

# Next steps:

We understand how important it is for you to know what your children are learning so you can support them over the year. Annual overviews for each year group can be found on the school website under the 'Curriculum' tab. Each class has an eSchools page which also gives information



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about learning in the classroom. More recently, we have increased our activity on twitter where parents can see regular updates about classroom learning.

We recognise that this is an area that we can improve on as a school and we will continue to look at ways that we can improve in this area.

The school supports my child's wider personal development.

### Next steps:

We will continue to show how St Mary's develops its links with local primary and secondary schools, in particular, with Bishop Challoner. Children across the school benefit from lessons and workshops led by Bishop Challoner both at St Mary's and at Bishop Challoner School.

This year, we will continue to fundraise to support local charities, having just supported SIFA Fireside with our recent Harvest collection.

When Covid restrictions allow, we will continue to check in on our neighbours at the local retirement home and work closely with them for the benefits of pupils and residents.

The school council are currently working closely with the PTA to address parking issues around school and we look forward to seeing the benefit of their work as the year progresses.

Children are encouraged to join committees such as school council and spiritual council to represent the views of their peers to SLT. In Year 6, prefects show parents around school and the Head Boy / Head Girl, lead via example.

"Very happy with all the work everyone is doing"

"Staff have been very friendly and let us sit and read child books development in such a friendly way."

"School book bag policy is a waste of money and resources. As long as bags aren't too big they should be allowed what they have."

The decision to move to book bags only is made in the interests of health and safety. The cloakroom areas in school become hazardous when the children bring in large rucksacks that take up a lot of space, often resulting on the bags ending up on the floor.
